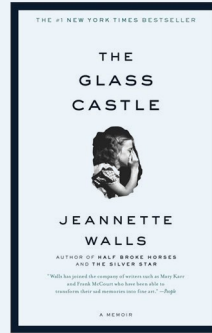

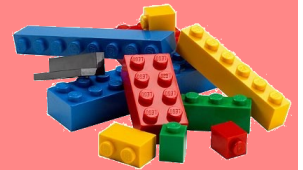
LEGO Extravaganza

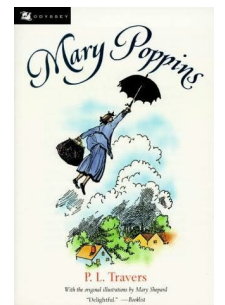
Come hear a story about construction. Then let your imagination take over and use your skills to create LEGO masterpieces.
